The breakfast was a complete success due to the hard work of a number of dedicated people that included: seven Auxiliary members, four community volunteers, and eight members from our great FIRE DEPARTMENT.

THE FIRE DEPARTMENT WELCOMES FALLAND FIRE SAFETY

The Fire Department welcomed the cooler weather this October! Not only did we meet fall last month, but October was our Fire Safety Month. Our Chief and Administrator have been working with State Farm Insurance to apply for a grant that will supply us with smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for our community. These detectors will be for your standard home and also for mobile and motor homes! If approved for this grant, it will be a great asset to our community.

Speaking of smoke detectors, please don't forget to change the batteries in your smoke detectors once a year, and replace any detectors that are over ten years old. If you need any assistance with maintaining your smoke detectors, please contact the Desert Hills Fire Department and we would be more than happy to assist you!

Along with October being Fire Safety Month, we as a department attended Home Depots SafetyFair which was geared towards teaching children and the community about safety. At the Safety Fair we brought E-21 and the community got to climb in our engine and check out our equipment. We got the chance to explain to the public what some of our equipment is used for, and we passed out plastic fire hats and stickers to the children. We also brought a little fire engine wagon that the children were able to ride in while one of the fire fighters pulled them around. All in all, it was a great time to interact with the public and teach them about safety.

We also had the organization Mile Marker Therapy come to our department with a group of their students. DHFD gave them a tour of the fire department. The children got to see one of our fire-fighters put his fire gear and air pack on. Each of the children got to spray water out of a fire hose, and we taught them what to do if they were to ever catch fire; STOP, DROP, and ROLL! The children were taught what number to call (9-1-1!) in case of an emergency, or a fire. We have done a great deal contributing to Fire Safety Month and we will continue to do so!

October was also Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and our department was supporting the cause by wearing pink duty shirts! So if you were wondering why our firefighters were wearing pink, now you know! We were able to sport these shirts on some calls last month as well. Our department ran quite a few medical calls in October, along with a head on collision in front of Lowes that involved seven patients, and a couple car fires. We even had some mutual aid calls as well, which is where we send one of our engines to assist Lake Havasu City Fire.

To wrap up last month's happenings, we would like to thank everyone who came to Octobers Pancake Breakfast. As well as to those who made it a success! We would also like to encourage our community to stay safe, and stay healthy. 

MOVE OVER, IT'S THE LAW

In light of a recent "Close Call" our Desert Hills Firefighters experienced last month on I-40, we would like to remind everyone to **Move Over or Pull Over** when you see Flashing Emergency Lights.

Our Firefighters were on scene of a single vehicle accident when a semitruck driver plowed through our scene at a high rate of speed, striking a passenger vehicle causing a second accident. Luckily no firefighters were injured, but it was a "close call" and reminder of how dangerous our job is.

Arizona's "Move Over" law requires motorists to move over one lane — or slow down if it is not safe to change lanes — when driving by any vehicle with flashing lights pulled to the side of a road or highway.





Arizona's "Move Over" law applies to all vehicles with flashing lights pulled over on any freeway, multilane highway or city road or street. It aims to protect everyone who uses our roads and highways and everyone who works on or next to them.

Drivers who are cited for violating the law could be required to pay a fine ranging from \$150 to \$650 depending upon jurisdiction. Arizona Revised Statute 28-775 (e)






DESERT HILLS FIRE DISTRICT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION NEWS


